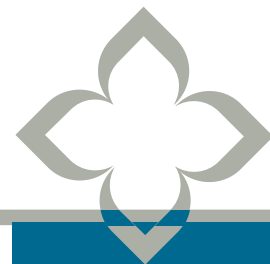

We provided a diverse panel of residents to speak of their experiences during this time. Specifically, the panel members shared what it was like to be young women growing up and raising families during this tumultuous time in our country. The panel included Mrs. Bartlett and Mrs. Tanke from Deupree House and Mrs. Reed, Mrs. Lilly and Mrs. Hunter from Marjorie P. Lee.

The girls and our panel covered a wide array of topics including the rise of feminism, the assassination of President Kennedy, dating life for a young woman, Elvis, college entry and dorm life, the Vietnam war, nursing careers, childbirth, adoption and more. We told them nothing was off limits and they took us up on it.

Our resident panel was able to give them a first-hand perspective. The girls were so impressed and felt each woman was very progressive for the time, having all gone to college and enjoyed successful careers, while also raising families. They shared unique perspectives on each and every topic, which the girls were most grateful to learn, making their book knowledge really come alive.

The panel members also shared some neat connections with a couple of the girls. The girls were happy to learn that several of our residents went to an all-girl high school as well (MND is an all-girl, Catholic high school). Two of our residents went on to even attend an all-girls college! One student is going to Purdue next year to study Engineering. This is where Mrs. Bartlett went to col-

lege and studied engineering as a young woman as well. Another student was going to Xavier University next year to study nursing. She had many questions for Mrs. Reed as she was a nurse for over 50 years. Our time with the students proved that CLLE is as much about connections as anything!
