Dear Residents and Families,

During our routine surveillance testing this week, three staff members were identified as positive.

We have one direct care staff member at Episcopal Church Home who works on our Memory Care Household that tested positive for COVID-19. The staff member is quarantined at home. All residents and staff have been tested, and we are awaiting results. The Memory Care Household is now under quarantine.

We have two positive cases at MPL. One non-direct staff member and one private duty staff member tested positive for COVID-19. In both cases, the staff members are quarantining at home. Any residents or staff who have had close contact have been tested and are awaiting results.

We also have an occurrence of respiratory symptoms at Marjorie Lee. An occurrence is defined as three or more residents or staff with new-onset COVID-19 respiratory symptoms in 72 hours. There are no trends or interactions among the staff and residents having respiratory symptoms. All involved have been tested, and we are awaiting results.

Other results from our routine testing are detailed below:

- Deupree House and Cottages: 159 negatives, 0 positive, and 1 pending
- Episcopal Church Home: 161 negatives, 1 positive (reported above)
- Marjorie Lee: 123 negatives, 2 positives (reported above), and 150 pending
