**Harold and Lillian: A Hollywood Love Story (2015)**      **Stars:** Lillian and Harold Michelson

**Plot:** Storyboard artist Harold Michelson and his wife, film researcher Lillian Michelson, were a talented couple once considered the heart of Hollywood. Harold and Lillian worked on hundreds of iconic films during Hollywood’s golden age, including “The Ten Commandments,” “The Apartment,” “The Birds,” “Full Metal Jacket,” and more. Although the couple were responsible for some of Hollywood’s most iconic examples of visual storytelling, their contributions remain largely uncredited.
