Hear the exciting sound of early music as the folks in the Middle Ages heard it on Hurdy Gurdy, Lute, Gittern, Psaltery, Gemshorn, Vielle, Cornamuse, Renaissance recorders, and drums. The instruments are briefly explained during the performance and afterward the audience is invited to inspect the instruments up close.
