The Sting (1973)

Stars: Paul Newman, Robert Redford, Robert Shaw

Plot: Following the murder of a mutual friend, aspiring con man Johnny Hooker teams up with old pro Henry Gondorff to take revenge on the ruthless crime boss responsible: Doyle Lonnegan. Hooker and Gondorff set about implementing an elaborate scheme, one so crafty that Lonnegan won't even know he's been swindled. As their big con unfolds, however, things don't go according to plan, requiring some last minute improvisation by the undaunted duo.

Title: Norman Rockwell: An American Portrait

Description: Americana legend Norman Rockwell walked into the offices of The Saturday Evening Post in 1916 and walked out as the new cover art illustrator for America's favorite magazine. So began Rockwell's career and the unique love affair between the artist and the American public. This documentary features the art and life of illustrator and painter, Norman Rockwell, complete with commentary and remembrances from art historians, close friends, and the artist himself to create an entertaining celebration of Norman Rockwell's American Legacy.
