The Age of Adaline (2015)

Stars: Blake Lively, Harrison Ford

Plot: Adaline Bowman has miraculously remained a youthful 29 years of age for nearly eight decades, never allowing herself to get close to anyone lest they discover her secret. A chance encounter with a charismatic philanthropist named Ellis Jones reawakens Adaline's long-suppressed passion for life and romance but complicates the eternal life she has come to know.

Title: The History of Jazz

Description: 1922: The story of jazz becomes the story of two great cities, Chicago and New York, and of two extraordinary artists whose lives and music span almost three-quarters of a century –Louis Armstrong and Duke Ellington. Meanwhile the bandleader Paul Whiteman tries to make jazz more like symphonic music – “to make a lady out of jazz” – and Fletcher Henderson plays soft, sweet music for white dancers only at the Roseland Ballroom. Then, in 1924, Louis Armstrong comes to New York to join the Henderson band and shows the whole world how to swing.

Title: Canyonlands

Description: Canyonlands is the little-known jewel of the American National Parks. The stark landscape of extraordinary features contains more than 300,000 acres of desert wilderness, towering spires, and spectacular canyons. But this rugged terrain is more than a pretty picture – it is a history book of time. Its stories stretch from the geologic forces that created this land, to the beginnings of life on earth and from ancient people, to the cowboys and outlaws of the Old West. Venture beyond the tourist hotspots and discover the hidden secrets of Canyonlands National Park.

Title: F. Scott Fitzgerald: Winter Dreams

Description: He is one of the most important writers of the 20th century, and his classic novel *The Great Gatsby* currently sells 350,000 copies per year. Yet in 1940, the last year of his life, F. Scott Fitzgerald earned just \$13.13 in royalties, and only eleven people came to his funeral. From St. Paul, Minnesota to the tip of Long Island to Paris –this riveting documentary about the man who wrote *This Side of Paradise*, *Tender is the Night*, and *The Last Tycoon* takes viewers on a uniquely American journey, providing an in-depth look at the writer’s life and work, his tortured marital relationship, and his troubled friendship with fellow colleagues such as Ernest Hemingway.

Title: Jim Henson: In Their Own Words

Description: Follow Jim Henson's career as he transcended puppetry to become one of the most creative, prolific, and influential artists of his time. Witness key events unfold in his life, from his early television work with the Muppets and his commercial work in the late 1950s and early 1960s, to his breakthrough with *Sesame Street*, *The Muppet Show*, *Fraggle Rock*, and his groundbreaking fantasy films *Dark Crystal* and *Labyrinth*.
