### Father Goose (1964)

## **Title: Walt Disney**

**Description:** *Walt Disney* offers an unprecedented look at the man who created a world and built an empire. Uniquely adept at art as well as commerce, Walt Disney was a master filmmaker who harnessed the power of technology to tell stories of outsiders struggling for acceptance and belonging, while questioning the conventions of class and authority. This film examines Disney's complex life and continuing legacy, featuring rare archival footage from the Disney vaults, interviews with biographers and historians, as well as the animators and designers who helped turn his dreams into reality. *Walt Disney* is both an inspiring story and a cautionary tale about the price of empire.

## **Title: Out of Ireland**

**Description:** *Out of Ireland* traces the story of flight from the famine-swept villages of 19th century Ireland to the industrialized cities of 20th century America. The program personalizes this transatlantic journey by focusing on the lives of eight specific immigrants, utilizing letters they wrote home to Ireland describing their experiences in the New World. The mid-19th century famine in Ireland set the stage for one of the first big waves of European immigrants to America. They tested and profoundly changed America's notion of itself. This film is about all Americans and the profound historical and psychological consequences which are our heritage as a nation of immigrants.
