The first thing first responders want to know is your list of medications. The difference between life and death when you've had a heart attack could be a copy of your previous EKG. When you can't speak for yourself, when you are confused, in pain or scared, the Vial of Life can speak for you. Emily has made packets for every resident on the property and they will be passed out this month. I

encourage everyone to participate. This will replace the previous Vial of Life program. Each kit will have 2 of the red squares. One is for the front door and one is for the packet. All contents should stay in the clear bag provided. Place the bag on the refrigerator with a magnetic clip. The other red square will be placed on the front door with a magnet or a piece of tape. If you need help please ask. This could be a **lifesaving** packet for first responders. Emily will be on the look out to see the red signs on the front door! We will also start planning for emergency evacuation program for our community. More news to come on this, but to start the program off, **I do need to know if there is anyone that needs physical help getting out of their apartment safely in the event of a fire or other emergency.** Please call Emily at 937-203-2035.
